Global fight against human trafficking

Parliamentarians across the world have been challenged to encourage governments to strengthen cooperation among law enforcement agencies to investigate, prosecute and share information to prevent human trafficking. Fikile Masiko, who is among the South African delegation to the 144th Inter-Parliamentary Union's (IPU's) Assembly, which is currently underway in Nusa Dua in Bali, made the call during a preparatory debate in the Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights on the proposed theme for the draft

The proposed theme must be written for the standing committee's consideration at the 145th IPU Assembly to take place later this year. The theme concerns parliaments' developmental role in countries with high levels of international migration, as well as their role in preventing all forms of human trafficking and human rights abuses, including that sponsored by the state. Masiko called for cooperation between law enforcement agencies to be accompanied by strong extradition treaties, pointing out that South Africa has such treaties with 18 other countries, to date.

She also called on parliamentarians to exercise their constitutional mandate to strengthen social and labour protection.

The vehicle came to a standstill. He was carried out of his vehicle to another vehicle while he was semi-conscious. He found himself in an unknown room and was given food by an unknown African male speaking English with a West African resonance. According to the victim he may have been drugged and did not know what happened until he was abandoned at a taxi rank in Johannesburg. He was not injured.

Rapist to spent life in prison

REE STATE - On 02 September 2019, at about 03:55, an 18-year-old girl returned from a tavern accompanied by her male friend. Along the way they were confronted by a suspect who assaulted the male friend who then ran

The girl was grabbed by the suspect who forced the victim into his residence where he raped her twice.

After the rape ordeal, the incident was reported to Hoopstad Police and a case of rape

was registered for further investigation. The case was assigned to Detective Sergeant Mkhehlane of Lejweleputswa District FCS Unit.

After thorough investigation, a 34-yearold suspect was arrested and found guilty as charged by Hertzogville Regional Court. On 22 March 2022, the accused Moleleki Petrus Sebilo (34), was sentenced to life imprisonment, Mr Bantu was prosecuting and Mr Mahlatsi was the Magistrate.
