Police warn motorists offering lifts to hitch-hiking strangers and pedestrians

Police sternly warn motorists on offering lifts to strangers and hitch-hikers about its dangers thereof, which might result in car hijackings, and other serious crimes.

This warning comes after an incident was reported on Sunday, 26 September 2021 where a lady was driving from Vredfort to Kroonstad. On her way she decided to stop the car on the side to check the meat in the boot, which is where one male approached her and requested for a lift. The lady whom was the

driver of the vehicle sympathized with the guy and gave him a lift. On their way near Ruitersbos farm they guy requested for the lady to stop as he wanted to relieve himself. The lady stopped and to her surprise she was pointed with a gun.

A quarrel ensued between them until they fought and the lady managed to overpower the guy. The person who was driving behind them witnessed the whole scene and managed to call the police for assistance. The

suspect was arrested and will be charged with attempted hijacking and pointing with a firearm. Members of the South African Police Service appeals with the community to use formal mode of transport than hitch-hiking and also for motorists not to give lifts to strangers. This has proven to be dangerous and must be avoided at all costs. The Acting District Commissioner Brigadier Mapulane Mbeloane warns community members to avoid hitch hiking and motorists are urged

to avoid offering lifts to strangers. “We are aware of the economic challenges that our people are faced with, however lives of citizens are more precious than anything else. A person’s life cannot be bought, one ought to be vigilant and avoid incidents that might later cost one’s life due to ignorance or desperation. Let us adhere to road traffic regulations at all times, advised Brigadier Mbeloane.
